Press conference at the start of the XIII International Pilgrimage of Altar Servers in Rome on 29 July 2024

Members of the Press,

it fills me with great enthusiasm to not only observe the tangible anticipation of the past few weeks, but also to be infected by it. I want to welcome the more than 35,000 altar servers from Germany to the XIII international pilgrimage to Rome.

The motto of this year's pilgrimage "with you" is a wonderful expression of what we have been able to experience here: community, fellowship and a profound faith which unites us. This pilgrimage offers our altar servers a special opportunity to look beyond their own church towers and realise that they are part of a worldwide community. Our altar servers are a beacon of hope for the whole Church in Germany. With their diverse commitment, they are present everywhere the Church is lived. They are joyous witnesses of the Gospel, despite any questions and doubts that they might have. We are proud of the courageous example that these young people give, and we can learn a lot from them.
